Join colleagues at the Metropolitan Museum of Art to view the exhibition "Man Ray: When Objects Dream." In the winter of 1921, Man Ray pioneered the rayograph, a new twist on a technique used to make photographs without a camera.

Led by Art's teachers from district 75, we will learn how to read a student's IEP, and how to tailor media arts education techniques like Green screen and stop motion for diverse populations.

HAPPYEND by Neo Sora - Recorded Intro by Neo Sora + Q&A with Film Comment 2024, Japan / US, 113 minutes, NYFF62 In Japanese with English subtitles

As a tie-in with Film Comment's Best of 2025 critics poll and editorial package, the film magazine is presenting a special screening of Neo Sora's Happyend, one of the staff's favorite films of the year. In this resonant drama set in a Tokyo high school sometime in the near future, two best friends since childhood, Kou and Yuta, run afoul of their disciplinarian principal, who has installed a draconian surveillance system after being the target of an elaborate prank. As the boys try to figure out how to align themselves within the increasingly oppressive education system, larger external forces summon further threats, including constant looming natural disasters. Director Neo Sora's absorbing and humane debut film tackles universal political fears, the tenuous bonds of friendship, and questions of individual will. This screening is an excellent fit for Japanese, History, Film/Media Studies, Asian Studies, Ethics/Philosophy, ELA and Social Studies classes.

FILM EDUCATION PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT DAY

This free full-day professional workshop (9 AM-4 PM) brings together teachers, educators, administrators and teaching artists for a day of collective reflection and exchange on the role of film in education. The program opens with a film screening followed by an interactive session exploring how the film can be integrated across disciplines and learning contexts. A roundtable on best practices in film education will encourage dialogue among participants, while afternoon breakout sessions offer advanced, hands-on approaches to incorporating film into literacy and arts curricula. 
Maysles Documentary Center
